



EARLY YEARS AT WESTFIELD

Westfield Nursery Fees and Sessions

Westfield participates in the government scheme whereby children who are 3 and 4 years old receive free nursery education. This is administered by means of a reduction in fees to parents of eligible children each term. We are pleased to be able to offer 30 free hours; we have developed our pricing structure to give parents the flexibility of choosing mornings or full days as we recognise the needs of busy parents.

Westfield is a through school; we have been educating girls aged between 3 and 18 since 1960 and, therefore, have a great deal of experience in running a happy and nurturing Early Years setting. The session schedule is designed to help your daughter settle into pre-school effectively and make her transition into Reception a seamless experience.

- Our core day is from 8.30 - 3.30 pm
- Drop off time: You may drop off your daughter at school any time between 8:00 and 8.30 am
- Pick up time: You may collect your daughter anytime between 3.30 and 3.45 pm (or at 12.45 pm if you choose mornings only)
- Full day session: 8:00 am till 3:45 pm (7 and $\frac{3}{4}$ hour)
- Morning session: 8:00 am till 12.45 pm (4 and $\frac{3}{4}$ hour)

Provided they are toilet-trained, children may join Early Years once they have reached the age of three years. However, a child must already be 3 years old by 1 September to receive the entitlement in the Autumn Term, by 1 January to receive the entitlement in the Spring Term and by 1 April to receive the entitlement in the Summer Term. Once a child has reached the age of 5 years, they are no longer eligible for this entitlement.

Each term the school notifies the Local Authority of all eligible children on the school roll. Parents do not need to claim the entitlement. However, parents of children who attend the Nursery class part-time must declare if their child also attends another setting when not at Westfield.

Parents can also increase the number of sessions attended throughout the school year, usually at the beginning of each new term. Please note that we will accept employer childcare voucher payments for Nursery places.

Early Years' Frequently Asked Questions

When can I apply for my daughter to start Westfield nursery and how much would it cost?

We accept registrations from birth and admissions for girls aged 3 years, provided they are already toilet trained. Please see table on following page for indicative fee levels.

When can I take advantage of the government's free funding?

Your daughter will be entitled from the term after she has turned 3 years of age and will continue to be funded until the end of the term in which she turns 5 years i.e. in Reception.

How much would my fees become when I receive the funding benefit?

Why are some sessions not available?

We are a deliberately small Early Years setting and there are limited places on offer. To enable us to provide high quality nursery provision, priority will be given to girls who attend on a full time basis and those who already have siblings enrolled at Westfield.

Is school lunch compulsory?

Yes, we believe that having lunch with their peers plays a positive part in a child's pre-school experience and prepares them well for life in school. We do not offer afternoon-only sessions.

What is the minimum number of days my child can attend?

This depends on the age of the individual child. We expect our very youngest nursery pupils to enrol for at least three days each week and to increase their hours on a phased termly basis. We reserve the right to stipulate certain days of the week based on demand, as our Early Years places are limited but we will endeavour to meet parental preferences where we are able to do so. Full-time attendance is expected by the start of the Summer term before the child moves up to Reception.

Extras (*as applicable*): Breakfast Club from 7:30 am, after school Twilight Care until 6:00 pm, educational visits, milk, and any extra-curricular activities in which the parents have agreed their child may participate. Parents are advised beforehand of any charges that will be incurred.
