You will be an excellent communicator who will work well with all members of the community. ## MUSIC AT WESTFIELD

At Westfield we recognise every girl as an individual with her own talents and areas of expertise. Creative and Performing Arts are central to our holistic approach and so Music plays a very important role in life at Westfield; Music is taught from Early Years to GCSE. Extra-curricular musical groups are popular and vary from year to year. This year we have Junior and Senior Choirs, Rock Band, Jazz Band and Musical Theatre club. In previous years orchestra and wind ensembles have joined ukulele groups in the extra-curricular programme.

The Music department puts on two main whole school concerts through the year as well as performing at our Carol Service. There are many other, smaller events and Music and Drama work closely together to put on a Senior House annual production jointly with Newcastle School for Boys. Many girls also organise their own music making and a number of groups have performed at recent concerts. We have also sung carols in Eldon Square and at other charity events.

Many girls have individual lessons on their instruments either in school or with outside teachers; a number of teachers visit the school during the week and girls can be taught one of the whole range of orchestral instruments as well as harp, piano, theory, singing and classical guitar. Many girls also enter Associated Board or similar examinations and annually we have a long list of successes at all grades.
