

UNCOLLECTED CHILD POLICY FOR PARENTS

JUNIOR HOUSE

At the end of every day, Form Teachers ensure that all girls from EYFS to Lower Three (Year 6) are collected by a parent / carer or designated adult. Girls in Upper Two / Lower Three may be allowed to make their own way home if we have received written parental / carer permission.

At the end of the school day, girls remaining at school will be supervised in Clubs or in Twilight Care. If any girl is not collected by ten minutes after the end of the school day the following actions will be taken.

- The teacher on duty will escort the girls to Twilight Care.
- At 4.30 pm, when Clubs end, the teacher on duty will escort the girls left in school to after-school care
- If a child remains uncollected quarter of an hour after Twilight care finishes, i.e. 6:15 pm, and no contact can be made with the child's parents / carers, then the Designated Safeguarding Officer (DSL) or member of the Senior Leadership Team (SLT) and Social Services may be contacted. The member of staff on duty will wait with the child until the DSL or member of the SLT arrive or they are collected either by Social Services or a parent / carer, whoever is first to arrive. Messages to this effect will be left on all the telephone numbers of the parents / carers and emergency contacts.
- On occasions when no after school care is provided as, for example, on the last day of term, If, 15 minutes after the school day ends, there has been no contact to explain a delay in collection, Westfield staff will begin contacting parents / carers and /or emergency numbers. If it is impossible to contact parents / carers, the child will remain with Westfield staff who will continue to try to contact parents / carers. If, after half an hour, no contact has been made with the parents / carers and Westfield staff have been unsuccessful in establishing a reason for the delay, the Designated Safeguarding Officer (DSL) or other member of the Senior Leadership Team will be contacted.
- All girls will remain the responsibility of the school and under no circumstances will a girl be taken from school by any person who is not authorised to collect her.

SENIOR HOUSE

Girls may remain supervised in school until 6.00 pm. If a child is not collected by then, the teacher on duty will begin contacting parents /carers and/or emergency numbers.

- If it is impossible to contact parents / carers, the child will remain with the member of staff on duty who will continue to try to contact parents.
- If a child remains uncollected quarter of an hour after supervision finishes, i.e. 6:15 pm, and no contact can be made with the child's parents / carers, then the Designated Safeguarding Officer (DSL) or member of the Senior Leadership Team (SLT) and Social Services may be contacted. The member of staff on duty will wait with the child until the DSL or member of the SLT arrive or they are collected either by Social Services or a parent / carer, whoever is first to arrive. Messages to this effect will be left on all the telephone numbers of the parents / carers and emergency contacts.
