Class Focus Texts – Escape from Pompeii / The Roman Record

Drama, Speaking and Listening

- Discuss words and phrases that capture readers' interest and imagination
- Draw inferences about characters' feelings, thoughts, emotions and actions

Writing

- Plan writing by discussing writing similar to that which they are planning to write, learning from its structure, vocabulary and grammar
- Draft and write by composing and rehearsing sentences orally
- Write non-chronological report based on Pompeii
- Write a newspaper report

- Identify word class e.g. nouns, verbs, adverbs, adjectives
- Capital letters, full stops and paragraphs
- Contractions

Science

Rocks and fossils



- Identify different types of rock: sedimentary, igneous, metamorphic
- Compare and group together different kinds of rocks on the basis of their appearance and simple physical properties
- Describe in simple terms how fossils are formed when things that have lived are trapped within rock
- Recognise that soils are made from rocks and organic matter

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Humanities

History - Changes in Britain from the Stone Age to Iron Age



- Julius Caesar's attempted invasion in 55-54 BC
- The Roman Empire by AD 42 and the power of its army
- Successful invasion and conquest by Claudius, including Hadrian's Wall
- British resistance and Boudica
